"What do you want here?" he cried out to them. "Go away at once; Jesus Christ has redeemed me, and I cannot be lost along with you, because I have always placed in Him all my confidence."

While he was saying these words, the evil spirits vanished, and he died in peace.

There is no more certain way of overcoming this temptation of despair at the hour of death than by being very devout to Our Blessed Lady during life, for those whom Our Lady loves and protects may confidently expect to be loved by her Divine Son.

Each month, a Mass is offered for deceased members listed in the monthly letter as above; and another Mass is offered for all past deceased members.



Through The Heart of Jesus

When you come to visit Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament look at Him and love Him even with your many faults, defects and infidelities. His love for you is very great. Ask Him to lift you to His Heart. We, as children of God, can relate to the following selections of St. Therese's writings on Confidence in God and Spiritual Childhood. (Ed.) Abandonment

"I am not always faithful. I often fail to make one of those little sacrifices which give so much peace to the soul; but I do not get discouraged. Instead, I abandon myself in the arms of Jesus: I endure the trial of having less peace at that moment and try to be more watchful the next time.... O my dear Mother, how sweet is the way of love! We can fall, of course; we can commit many infidelities, but according to St. John of the Cross, 'love knows how to draw profit from everything and it quickly consumes whatever might have displeased Jesus.' All, then, that remains at the bottom of our hearts is a humble and profound peace."

"A glance of love cast towards Jesus and the knowledge of our profound misery makes reparation for everything." "We have only to beg pardon and all repaired by that act of love. Jesus opens His Heart to us. He forgets our infidelities and does not want to recall them. He will do even more: He will love us even better than before we committed that fault."

"I entrust my infidelities to Jesus for, in my audacious abandonment to Him, I believe that I shall in this way gain greater power over His Heart and attract more fully the love of Him who came not to call the just but the sinners."

Consider a small child who has vexed his mother by a display of bad temper or disobedience. If the child hides in a corner through fear of punishment, he feels that his mother will not forgive him. But if instead, he extends his little arms towards her and with a smile cries out: 'Love, kiss me, mamma, I will not do it again,' will not his mother press the little one to her heart with tenderness, and forget what the child has done? And yet, though she knows very well that her dear little one will misbehave again at the next opportunity, that means nothing if the child appeals to her heart. He will not be punished...."
