

The Dying Father

Not long ago a poor man, the father of a large family, was struck down by a dangerous illness. He felt the hand of death upon him, yet he was calm and happy.

His children were standing near his bed weeping, and praying to God that their dear father might not be taken away from them.

You have lived a hard and laborious life, and had many sorrows and trials, and now, even when death is at hand, and you are enduring so much pain, you seem not to feel it."

"My dear child," he answered, "long, long ago, when I was a little boy, my mother used to tell me what I have often told you all those words of the Scripture:

Keep the Lord always before thine eyes, and fear His holy name.

These few words gave me courage in my trials, and were my defense in the moment of danger, and now they are my greatest consolation. For they have led me to the gate of my heavenly home, and I die with the firm hope that they will lead me into the presence of Him Whom I have

had always present in my heart. It is this that makes me so calm now and so resigned. And if you do as I have done, you also, at the hour of your death, shall be filled with the same blessed hope."

This was the only legacy this poor man had to leave to his little ones, but it was of more value than the richest gift that the world could bestow.

The Sight of God: Happiness of the Elect

Reflection – Our Greatest Treasure:

The possession which gives to the soul its fullness of bliss is that of **seeing a loving God** face to face. **St. Augustine** says that were God to let His beautiful face be seen by the damned, hell with all its torments would become to them a paradise.

But in paradise the soul is certain that it loves God, and is loved by God ; and it sees that that sweet tie of love which holds it united with God will never be loosened throughout all eternity.

-- Means of God's Love --

The flames of its love will be increased by the clearer knowledge which the soul will then possess of what the love of God has been in **being made man**, and having **willed to die** for it;

in having **given Himself in the sacrament of the Eucharist**.

by beholding, in all their distinctness, the **graces which He has given it**, in order to lead it to heaven;

it will see that the **crosses sent** to it in lifetime have all been operations of His love to render it happy.

It will see the **mercies He has granted it**, the many **lights and calls to penance**.
