Love is a Fire that inflames the Heart

God had ordered, in the ancient law, that there should be a fire kept continually burning on his altar: "The fire on the altar shall always burn." (Lev. vi. 12)

Altars of God:

St. Gregory says, that the altars of God are our hearts, where He desires that the fire of His Divine love should always be burning; and therefore the Eternal Father, not satisfied with having given us His Son Jesus Christ, to save us by His death, would also give us the Holy Ghost, that He might dwell in our souls, and keep them constantly on fire with love.

In flames Our Hearts:

And Jesus Himself declared, that He had come into the world on purpose to inflame our hearts with this holy fire, and that He desired nothing more than to see it kindled: "*I am come to cast fire upon the earth; and what will I but that it be kindled?*" (Luke xii. 49)

Tongues of Fire:

O most loving Redeemer, Thou dost, then, love us as well in Thy sufferings and ignominies as in Thy kingdom of glory! Hence it was that the Holy Ghost chose to appear in the upper-room under the form of tongues of fire: *"And there appeared to them parted tongues, as it were of fire."* (Acts ii. 3)

Prayer to The Holy Spirit:

And hence the Church teaches us to pray: "May the Holy Ghost, we beseech Thee, O Lord, inflame us with that fire which Our Lord Jesus Christ came to cast upon the earth, and which He ardently desired should be enkindled."

Effects of The Holy Fire:

This was the Holy Fire which has inflamed the saints to do so great things for God,

- 1) to love their enemies,
- 2) to desire contempt,
- 3) to deprive themselves of all earthly goods, and
- 4) to embrace with delight even torments and death.

Acts of Love:

Love cannot remain idle, and never says, "It is enough." The soul that loves God,

the more she does for her beloved,
the more she desires to do, in order to please him,
and to attract to herself his affections the more.

Means: Mental Prayer:

This holy fire is enkindled by mental prayer: *"In my meditation a fire shall flame out."* (Ps. xxxviii. 4) If, therefore, we desire to burn with love towards God, let us love

prayer; this is the blessed furnace in which this divine ardor is enkindled.

Of The Necessity Of Prayer

Prayer places our understanding in the divine brightness and light and exposes our will to the warmth of heavenly love.

There is nothing that so effectually purges our understanding of its ignorance and our will from its depraved affections.

It is the holy water that by its flow makes the plants of our good desires grow green and flourish,
that cleanse our souls from their imperfections, and
that quenches the thirst of passion in our hearts.

Mental Prayer

Above all, I recommend to you mental prayer, the prayer of the heart, and particularly that which concerns the life and Passion of Our Lord.

By making Him often the subject of your meditation, your whole soul will be filled with Him. You will learn His ways and frame all your actions according to His model. He is "the light of the world." It is, therefore, in Him and by Him and for Him that we must be instructed and enlightened. He is the tree of desire, in whose shade we must refresh ourselves. He is the living fountain of Jacob, in which we may wash away all our stains. In fine, little children, by hearing their mothers talk, lisp at first and learn at length to speak their language. So also by keeping close to Our Savior, by meditation and by observing His words, actions, and affections, by the help of His grace, we shall learn to speak, to act, and to will like Him.

Introduction to Devout Life by St. Francis de Sales

"Pray Always"

It is well to bear in mind that in commanding us to pray always Our Savior did not mean actual prayer, as that would be an impossibility.

The desire to glorify God by all our actions suffices for the rigorous fulfilment of this precept, if this desire be habitual and permanent. "You pray often," says St. Augustine, "if you often have a desire to pay homage to God by your actions: you pray always if you always have this desire, no matter how you may be otherwise employed."

You should never omit or neglect the duties of your state of life in order to say certain self-imposed prayers. These duties are a substitute for prayers and are equally efficacious, St. Thomas teaches, for obtaining the graces you stand in need of and which are promised to those who ask them properly. It is even more meritorious to perform some work for the love of God, to whom we offer it, than merely to raise the soul to Him by actual prayer.

Make frequent use of the prayers called ejaculations, — which are short and loving aspirations that raise the soul to its Creator. According to St. Francis de Sales, ejaculations can in case of necessity replace all other prayers, whereas all other prayers cannot supply for the omission of ejaculations.

"Acquire the habit of making frequent ejaculations. They are sighs of love that dart upwards to God to sue for His aid and succor. It will greatly facilitate this custom if you keep in mind the point of your morning's meditation that you liked best and ponder it over during the day. In sickness let pious ejaculations take the place of all other prayers.
